#### THE DEPARTMENT OF MANAGEMENT STUDIES

#### **ANNUAL REPORT 2021-22**

The Department of Management Studies was established in 2008. Since then it has been active to ensure all-round development of its students.

In the academic year the department had a strength of 428 students. The department is proud to share that it has a demand ratio of 1: 6.25 for admission.

The department has been working to reduce industry-academia gap by making internship, research and field visits a part of academics. This year 131 students did internships, more than 50 students did research from second and third year, 1 student made entrepreneurship based project and the department took third and second year students on field trips. Teachers and students had published 20 research papers in national and international conferences. 7 groups participated in Avishkar, a university level research conclave and 1 paper got selected for finals.

The department has won many laureates for the institution and department. Akshat Aggarwal (TYBMS) got selected for final round of Avishkar, Advith Poonja (TYBMS) got recognized for outstanding performance in throw ball at national level, Rohanbahadur (TYBMS) got third position at zonal round of Youth Fest in Cartooning, Anuj Gharat (SYBMS) go selected in University football team, Swasthik Shetty (SYBMS) won Mr. Bunts at Akanksha 2022. The department won OVERALL SPORTS CHAMPIONSHIP TROPHY for the fifth time.

For skill development, the department conducted four certificate courses. HRM Basics for Working Professionals was introduced this year. Under PERSONA, the department conducted activities like lecture series on Company Accounts, Session on Canva by Kunjal Pal (alumnus) Session on Creative Commons, How to Write a Research Paper, How to Make a Blog, How to Write a Press Release. For experiential learning, apart from field Trips, the department conducted nearly 28 CAPSULE ACTIVITIES. The department provides various knowledge sharing platforms to the students like THE KNOW SHOW in which we conducted three online and offline events, THE MANAGEMENT ASSOCIATION which is the club of management students also provides many such opportunities. This year the department introduced a new initiative BMS WEEKLY for weekly business news analysis.

For career guidance, the department organized sessions by higher education institutions like Alliance, Bangalore, Ideal Academy, MAAC, IBS etc. The department organized sessions on career guidance under CROSSROADS. Session on stock broking was organized by Dashrath Prajapati (Alumnus).

For implementation based learning, the department organized AMALGAM – Event Management and IMC activity and ENRICH ECOLUTION for making FYBMS students environmentally conscious.

#### THE TWELVE LAWS OF KARMA



#### **HOW I GOT LEH'D....**

I have visited many places in India, each place being different from the other with respect to food, culture, lifestyle, etc. Each place I visited gave me a different experience. But one of my favourite places is "LADAKH".

Ladakh is also Said to be "the land of highest passes". I visited this place with my family a few years ago. It was a tour of 8 days. We boarded the flight at 4 am in the morning and reached our destination at 8 am as it was a cut journey via Jammu. Ladakh is located at a higher altitude of 7742 m above sea level, hence when we reached there we felt the drastic change in the climate straight from 27 degree to 3 degree it also went upto -4 degree during the night.

On the first day of the tour we stayed at the hotel to get ourselves acclimatized to the climate so as



to not face breathing problems or any other health issues. On the second day, we visited the Shey Palace which is located on a hillock in shey, which is 15 km to the south of Leh. Shey was also known as the summer capital of Ladakh in the past.

The view from the palace was mesmerizing and full of greenery around. After this we visited the "Druk Padma Karpo" school also known as Rancho school after the famous bollywood movie "3 idiots" was

shot there. We saw the famous idiotic wall at the school. The school also has an outlet which sells customized (related to the movie like its characters, dialogues, etc) articles like t-shirts, mugs, caps, bottles, bags, etc. The third place we visited after this was the "Hemis Monastery" (Buddhist monastery). The monastery is structured in a rectangular shape. It has a museum which has antique articles used by the kings and their families in the past like Swords, jewellery, cloths, etc. Hemis Festival is celebrated every year in the early june in honour of padmasambhava. On the third day we left for Nubra valley which is 120 km to the north of leh. Nubra is also called "Dumra" meaning valley of flowers. On the way we visited the famous "Khardungla Pass" - The highest motorable road in the word. Here I experienced my first snowfall, it was the best experience ever. It is also recommended to not be out at khardungla pass for more than 30 mins to avoid breathing problems. After that we headed ahead to Nubra valley where we had a tent stay for a night that again was a different experience for me. We later went to a place called cold desert in nubra. It is just a desert like other deserts but since it is located in the Great Himalayas it is called the Cold Desert. The temperature here goes from zero degrees to -30 degrees. One can experience freezing winds the entire day. The surrounding area was full of greenery and surrounded by mountains. The next morning there was a complete change in the surroundings as the trees and mountains were all covered with snow and it was a completely different scenery. We had our breakfast and left back for Ladakh. On the way we visited the "Diskit monastery" also known as Diskit Gompa which is the oldest and the largest Buddhist monastery in the Nubra Valley of Ladakh and was founded in the 14th century. On the way we were stuck at khardungla pass for 2-3 hrs due bad weather conditions and heavy snowfall the roads were blocked. We finally left from there and reached the hotel safely. After that we had our dinner and slept.

On the fifth day we visited the famous Pangong Tso or Pangong Lake which is at a height of almost 4350m and is also the world's highest saltwater lake which is seen in shades of blue. It is 134 km long of which one third is in India and two third is in china. The lake water is too cold and is said to be holy to the

which one third is in India and two third is in china. The lake water is too cold and is said to be holy to the local people. On the way back we visited the Changla pass which means northern pass. It is also said to be the highest pass in ladakh. We waited there for some and then left back for our hotel. On the sixth day we left for kargil on the way we visited the Pathar Sahib



Gurudwara followed by Magnetic Hill, it is a cyclops hill located in Leh. The layout of the area and surroundings create an illusion. After that we visited the sangam point that is where the river indus and zanskar meet. The view of the river's meeting was so good and pure. Then we went to our next destination which was the Alchi monastery which is again a Buddhist monastery located in the Alchi village in Leh district. The monastery is almost one thousand years old hence it has a Tibetan architecture; this Tibetan influence can also be seen in the local culture. We then had our lunch and headed to our next destination "Lamayuru". It is known for its monasteries and lunar landscape prominently known to the tourists as the "Moonscape" because it is claimed to have land similar to that on the moon. It is also one of the oldest and largest monasteries in Ladakh and



all surrounded with moonland which makes this place more beautiful. We then finally reached "Kargil" and checked into our hotel after which we visited the local market there and then came back and rested. The next morning we left to visit one of the most famous places in kargil that is "the Kargil War Memorial" this war memorial is built by the Indian Army in the town of Drass hence it is also known as Drass War memorial, commemorating the 1999 kargil war

between

India and

Pakistan. Before visiting the entire war memorial we were first shown a small AV of the life of the soldiers and how they executed the mission and how people lost their lives in the war. 26 July is observed as Kargil Vijay Divas every year. After that we left back for ladakh. On the eighth day we had our local sightseeing like the "Shanti Stupa"



which was built by the Japanese buddhist in 1991. This place is not only a tourist attraction because of its religious significance but also because of the panoramic view of the surrounding landscape. The second palace we visited was the "Hall of Fame". It is a museum run by the Indian army, this museum houses weapons, and all the other instruments used by the Indian soldiers. After that we visited the local leh market for shopping and had our lunch there itself. The next morning we left for Mumbai at 5 am. And that is how my trip to Ladakh came to an end.

This place was more of a different experience for me. I enjoyed this place very much and would definitely love to relive those moments again. I even got to learn one ladakhi word that is "Julley" which means hello, thank you, goodbye. Every place had something different to offer. Being in the mountains gives a different peace within. And that is why this was one of my favorite places ever.






### INSPIRATIONAL PERSONALITIES

#### **OYO-ROOMS**

#### **OYO Rooms - What is it?**

When OYO was first launched, it mainly consisted of budget hotels. Since then, OYO has grown to be one of the leading hospitality chains across the globe. As the company grew, it added thousands of hotels, vacation spaces, and millions of rooms around the world in countries like India, China, Brazil, Japan, and the U.S.

#### OYO Rooms - Who founded it?

In his capacity as a founder and CEO of OYO Rooms, Ritesh Agarwal traveled across India from the age of 17 and spent time in more than 100 hotels. He realized that there is a shortage of quality hotels within the reach of common people. Forbes and Business Insider did not list him as a billionaire yet, even though he is known as the second youngest billionaire in the world after Kylie Jenner.

#### What inspired Ritesh Agarwal to start OYO Rooms?

While in California, Ritesh Agarwal founded a company. This company will help manage a hotel owned by an Indian, who had previously worked with Oravel Stays. New Delhi, which was later renamed OYO, is the location of this hotel. The hotel improved the rooms and targeted budget-minded travelers who were looking for hotel reservations online. In the first month alone, the hotel's occupancy rates went from 19% to 90%.

#### **Startup Story of OYO Rooms?**

When Ritesh Agarwal returned to India, he was eager to apply his new knowledge and experience. Through Oravel Stays, he began reaching out to small hotel owners. All over the world, there are so many small-scale hotels with fewer than 150 rooms. There weren't many entrepreneurs who wanted to turn small properties into "quality experiences for the common man." He realized that OYO could grow from a single property to a handful of hotels. OYO stood for "one property, one brand, one dream."

A smart update of the hotel's interior, efficient service, and setting of dynamic pricing made the

customer and the hotel owner happy. By looking at what details guests cared most about at each price level, Agarwal put his own experiences to use. It is not uncommon for asset owners to spend

a lot of money on a chandelier, but they forego a good breakfast. Many hotels lack the white light that consumers like, which is the warm white. He went on to observe, "Only a few hotels perform well in terms of serving customers right. Customers are more likely to post positive online reviews and hotels prove profitable when they focus on these elements."

#### How did OYO become successful?

Agarwal was able to reach a broader audience with his knowledge of technology. OYO's pricing model was also improved by Riteish Agarwal for budget-friendly customers. By his estimate, OYO adjusted room rates for 1 million guests every day more than 50 million times. OYO has connected all assets' staff at the back end. For example, there is an app that lets hotel staff know which rooms need to be serviced. To make sure the management knew how clean the guest rooms were, they tracked how much time the housekeeper spent cleaning the rooms.

#### How does OYO's business model work?

In its early days, Oyo was a hotel aggregator that leased hotel rooms and then rented them under the brand. Eventually, it shifted to a franchise model from the aggregator model. In this process, the company partners with hotels, allowing them to work as franchises and rent out their rooms at reasonable

rates.

#### Where did Oyo get its funding from?

Ritesh Agarwal's startup Oyo needed funding after some hotels partnered with him. Oyo was seedfunded by Lightspeed Ventures, a Silicon Valley-based venture capital firm. Hedge funds and venture capital firms slowly followed. Included in this fund are Sequoia Capital, SoftBank Vision Fund, Greenoaks Capital. Oyo began expanding its wings to include all directions with the help of new funds. Major home sharing company Airbnb became interested in Oyo Homes. An estimated \$150 million has been in invested the company over the last few years.

#### Conclusion

The success story of This Startup Oyo is an inspiration for many small startups in India despite its many challenges. In addition to hotels, Oyo has expanded beyond its boundaries in India. One of the most promising startups in India at the moment is Oyo. Oyo Rooms' profits belong to Ritch Agarwal to the tune of 30%.


Paytm was founded by Vijay Shekhar Sharma who neither had the money or the resources to even start his journey but where there is will there is a way ,since childhood he lived in utter poverty in a small village of Aligarh city ,he had done his schooling from a Hindi — medium school near his village , he wanted to become an engineer so he wanted to learn English but he couldn't join any classes because his family was impoverished. Despite these difficulties he managed to get into the esteemed Delhi Institute of Technology but his struggle got even worse as he couldn't understand English , he was not able to understand anything taught by his teachers, he even failed his first year of engineering due to this language barrier, but he never gave up , he started going to the library to translate his subject books to Hindi and gradually taught himself to read, write and speak in English .

One day Vijay read a Forbes magazine where stories of Steve Jobs, Bill Gates, and ratan tata were mentioned after he felt highly inspired and w ted to achieve something big in his life. In his college, days he created a website indiasite.net but 2 years later he sold it. He started his company one97communications, he took various loans to expand his company but soon started going bankrupt, to put an end to the bankruptcy he developed software for Piyush Aggarwal's company which doubled their profit, but his loan growth grew up to a hefty amount when Vijay told Piyush, about this he purchased 40% shares of one97 communications thereby resolving the loan situation. The Board of Directors said that the profit of One97 Communications needed to be invested in somewhere as they cannot keep the dividends for a long time, he thought how could he use this money he noticed that china was growing fast in terms of technology why can't India grow too and that's when the idea of creating a payment platform came to his mind, he was given 5 crores for six months to decide on whether Paytm will be build or not.


On 8th July 2010, a website called Paytm.com was launched, it soon popularized due to the facility of paying bills, the Indian railways and Uber accepted the concept of wallet for payment and others followed along. In 2 years two lakh fifty thousand people were using Paytm.

In 2016, when demonetization had made using cash difficult Paytm became a platform for cashless transactions. More people started using Paytm and 200 million people were using Paytm by November 2017. Paytm is not only popular in cities but also in small towns and villages. It helped India to go cashless and became a revolution, Previously it was only used to make payments for limited things like mobile and DTH recharge and shopping bills but today people can make all kinds of payments like maintenance bills, rent, bank to a bank transfer, loans etc.

As of 2020 Paytm is valued at US\$16 billion, making it one of the highest valued fintech companies in the world.
