## REPORT ON INDUSTRIAL VISIT

#### DEPARTMENT OF MANAGEMENT STUDIES

The Department of Management Studies organized an Industrial Visit for the FY, SY and TY students of B.M.S. from 24 - 29 January, 2020 to Udaipur-Chittorgarh and Mount Abu.

The total number of students were 66 accompanied by 3 Professors – Ms. Nidhi Chandorkar, Mr. Ashish Navik and Adv. Hamid Khan. Two buses left from College premises at 8:00 AM on 24<sup>th</sup> January to reach Vasai station and then board the train to reach the predetermined destination – Udaipur, Rajasthan. 




# Was the itinerary followed?




Was corrective measures taken in case of any problem during the tour? 43 responses
